Dear Parishioners of Christ on the Mountain,

holiness at its core is experiencing the mysteries of life. Always ask the Spirit what Jesus expects from us at every moment of our life and in every decision we must make, so as to discern the mission we have received. May we come to realize what the word is, the message of Jesus that God wants to speak to the world by our lives. Let us be transformed. The Lord will bring to fulfillment despite our mistakes and missteps, provided that we do not abandon the path of love but remain ever open to his supernatural grace which purifies and enlightens.
