Second Sunday of Easter * Divine Mercy Sunday

Here we are. Even after hearing the words of Mary Magdalene, the Apostles are still fearful, stunned by all that took place in these past hours. Now one more surprise: "Jesus came, stood in their midst and said to them: Peace be with you." He breathed on them and said "Receive the Holy Spirit." (John 20:19-31) He breathed on them... The gift of the Holy Spirit is BREATH.

In Genesis, The Hebrew word used is RUAH, breath. The presence of the Spirit is the presence of God's breath!!!!!
